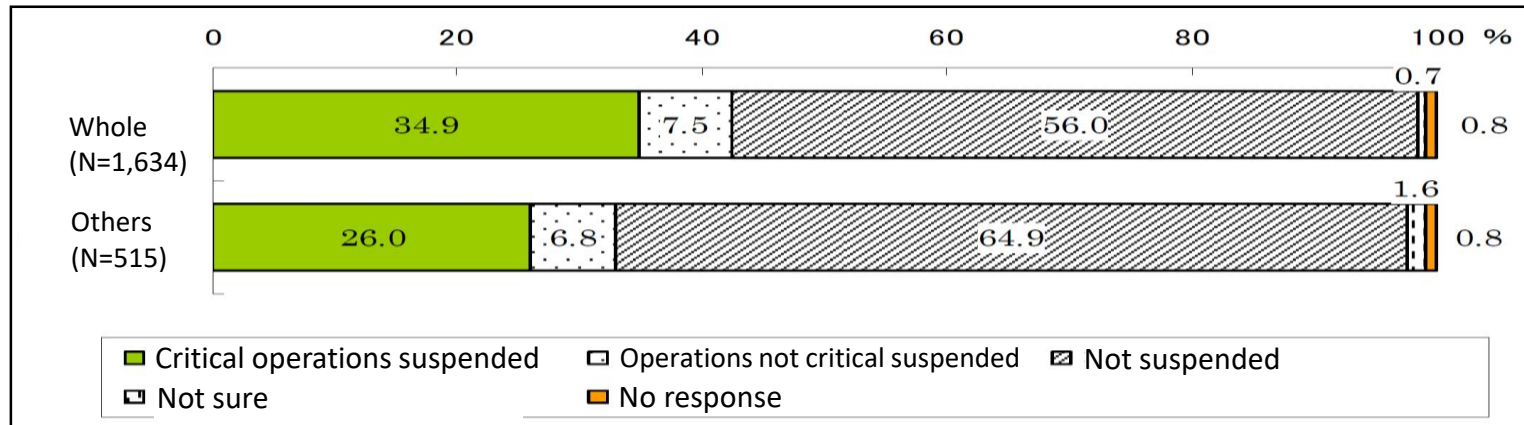
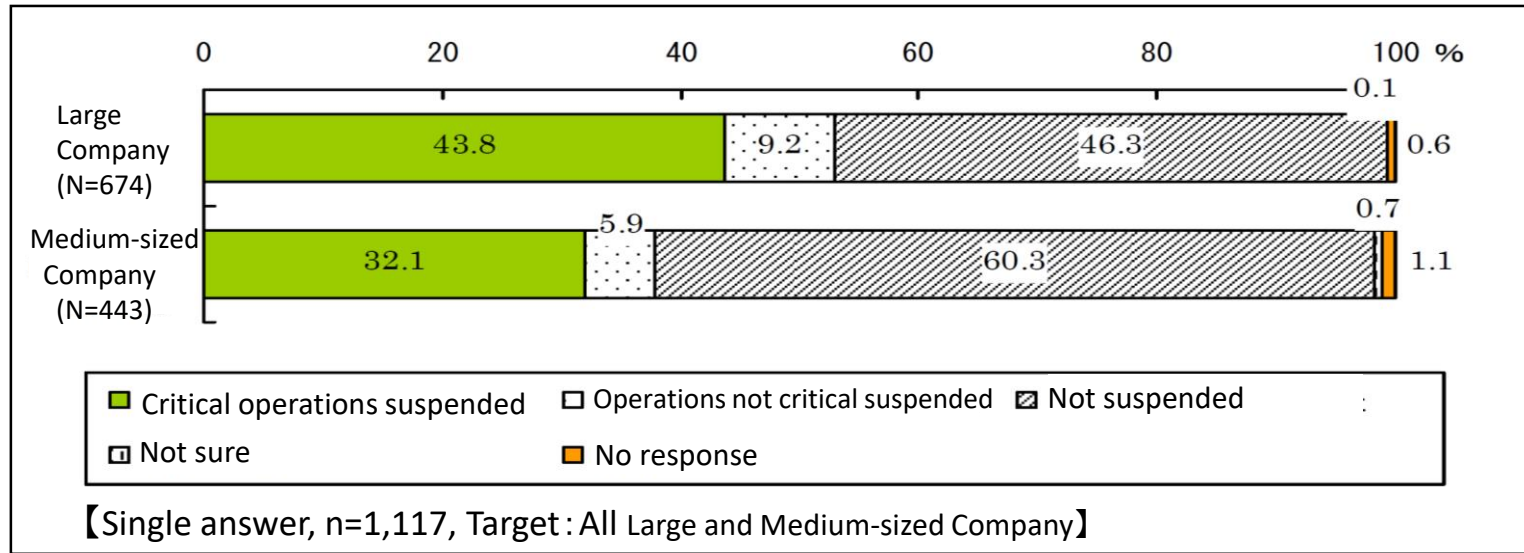


Critical Operations Were Suspended or Not at the Time of the Great East Japan Earthquake (as of November, 2011)
